

#### From the President

In the November <u>Australian Stamp Monthly</u> a regular contributor, Glen Stephens, devoted several pages to describing a truly appalling <u>Australia Post</u>, covering ground from dysfunctional robotics to dismal executives. I shall add my five cents worth.

In early June I posted a letter to New Zealand, wrongly guessing the correct postage. Back it came in late June, with a note telling me to add the correct postage. Fair enough, but twenty or so days between posting and return seemed over-long. More annoying, however, was the fact that the return mail came from the Western Australian Revenue Recovery Office, Perth; and my wrongly franked envelope had been cancelled not in Perth but in Newman, on the western edge of the Sandy Desert.
